ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF SHIP BOTTOM, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 10.20, WHICH PERTAINS TO TRAFFIC SCHEDULES

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend Chapter 10.20 to add stop sign regulations.

SECTION I

§10.20.030 is revised to add the following one-way street to Schedule V.

Shore Avenue and West 7th Street	2 Stop Signs on Shore Avenue
----------------------------------	------------------------------

SECTION II

All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION III

If any word, phrase, clause, section, or provision of this ordinance shall be found by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable, illegal, or unconstitutional, such word, phrase, clause, section, or provision shall be severable from the balance of the ordinance and the remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.


Effective date.

This ordinance shall take effect after final adoption and publication as required by law.

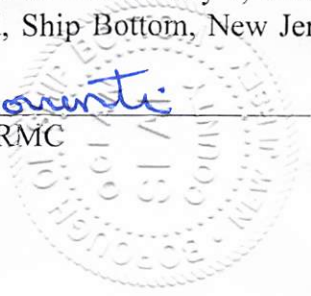

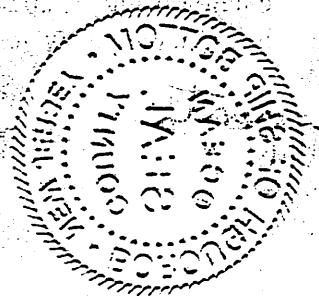
